Discussion: Communications reports were summarized. **Vote:** The motion was carried with 5 in favor and 0 opposed.

Portage Accident Update

Progress was summarized including discussions with an insurance adjuster, insurance company responsibilities, liability of the driver, project scope, repair and facade options, and next steps in the claims process.

Library Gardens Update

Updates included Portage canopies, clarification on the MOU with the city for Portage; South Haven's dry creek bed, stepping stones, bridge, native seeding & plugs, educational programming, and musical features; Kouts' variance approval, permits to break ground, canopy, interactive features, and ribbon cutting; Hebron's piano feature; obligation of ARPA funds and library funds. The possibility of renting gardens was discussed.

Construction Update

Updates included asphalt and concrete work, light bollards, and specs for the Portage roofing projects. It was recommended to go to bid for the Portage roof around October after roofing business has slowed. The Kouts roof work may take place in 2025. Additional discussion included plans for the lot the library owns in Portage.

May 2024 Director's Report

Overview

- May was an exciting month from a facilities standpoint as our Portage Library Garden
 ribbon cutting brought together members of the community and key stakeholders of the
 project to celebrate this amazing space that has already allowed our team the
 opportunity to enhance our programming from our very limited indoor attendance to a
 nearly unlimited amount of patron space.
 - Other facilities projects included the completion of the Portage parking lot enhancement, connecting our two lots, and repairing the entire lot.
 - The South Haven Library Garden has been able to make great progress as we addressed major drainage issues while providing another feature in our dry riverbed.
 - The Kouts Library Garden was able to move forward with support from the Town
 of Kouts as our variance was approved. We are now setting up our contractors to
 break ground sometime later this summer.
- Visitors at all of our branches increased as patrons began their summer breaks. Our team has been hard at work preparing for Summer Reading and our patrons are excited!

Buildings & Grounds

- Parking lot upgrades occurred in Portage and South Haven. The lots look amazing!
- The concrete Portage pad for garbage and new book drop location was installed. Fencing for the dumpster will be installed this summer.

- The Portage compressor was discovered to have a factory issue and needed to be replaced. Unfortunately, that replacement was broken as well and is on order. Until then, we are running, albeit inefficiently.
- Jesse met with local artists Rocco and Billy to look at possible mural options in the Portage Library Garden as well as climbable sculptures and bike racks for all branches.
- Jason and Aidan installed 12 storyboards for our trail in South Haven.
- The factory startup in South Haven for the HVAC system had a small issue as the technician destroyed a circuit board. Despite that hiccup, the system is up and running.
- Jesse met with Simko Signs regarding fixing the library branch signage. We are also having the brickwork fixed and this should provide a much-needed facelift for the exteriors of our facilities.
- The air handlers in Portage and Hebron had some issues as the belts and pulleys went out which resulted in the branches having no airflow. The issue was quickly resolved in time for the Summer heatwaves.
- Jack attended the Town of Kouts Board of Zoning Appeals public hearing about obtaining a fence variance for the Library Garden. With no one in opposition and community members speaking in support, the variance was granted.
- The bulk of Portage's garden construction was completed, as well as the parking lot reconfiguration project. Patrons and staff are very happy with the new layout of the parking lot and look forward to spending time in the new garden.
- The South Haven Library Garden's dry riverbed was installed. While the size needed to be larger than we had desired, it gave us an opportunity to create a more magical and whimsical place. Be on the lookout for giant footprints and a special bridge!

Technology

- Nathan worked on compiling board meeting minutes to post on our new website to improve our transparency with the public.
- Nathan is working on optimizing how some of our services are exposed in the new calendar system associated with our new website.
- Angela has been offboarding ProvenIT and getting everything ready to onboard Cardinal Point Technologies.
- Angela has been working with vendors to get cameras and audio equipment for our Portage library garden.
- Inge and Angela have been exploring how to improve our technology plan so that we are well-prepared for the next strategic planning cycle.

 Ceremony; attendees learned more about this wonderful space by listening to special
 guest speakers and engaging with the beautiful new spaces in the garden. Their
 experience was supplemented by enjoying refreshments and activities inside the branch.

- PCPLS received coupon donations to our Summer Reading Program from Culvers, Dairy Queen, Casey's, and Chick-fil-A for finisher prizes. PCPLS also received Cinemark Ticket donations for the Weekly Raffle Movie Lovers Bundle.
- Allison updated the encyclopedia/dictionary display in Valpo Youth Services to highlight PCPLS material resources and online databases. The new signage markets digital resources, such as World Book Online, that patrons may find useful for research purposes.

Youth and Teen Services

- Kouts and Hebron branches both had a great turnout for their Books, Balls, and Blocks program this month. Patrons love this partnership with the Porter County Community Foundation, and PCPLS is already working to coordinate dates for the rest of 2024 and well into 2025.
- Sandra held a Storytime in the Park at Woodland Park in Portage, and 19 people braved the rain and enjoyed a music-themed storytime to promote Dolly's Imagination Library.
- North County Programmers visited Fegely Middle School & Willow Creek Middle School
 this month. Visits to promote PCPLS to Teens as a part of our coordinated Portage
 School Visits, and plans to continue these coordinated visits next school year are
 already underway.
- Thomas Jefferson Middle School Booked a Librarian to visit their school after hours for a Lego Club and Game Night where staff promoted PCPLS programs & resources.
- PCPLS System Program Team scheduled a total of nine Book a Librarian requests this month, and reached over 1,900 students with coordinated Summer Reading Promo Presentations.
- The Kouts branch held its last art show for the school year in partnership with the Kouts Elementary School. The graduating 5th-grade class created some amazing clay sculptures in the art style of the book cover for the Last Dragon Chronicles by Chris d'Lacey.
- A local Girl Scout Troop booked a librarian visit for a Mother's Day plant party and it was held at the Valparaiso branch led by Allison and Emily.
- All 5 branches were designed and decorated by our talented staff members with our Summer Reading theme: "Adventure Begins at the Library!"
- The Hebron branch had a Big Blue Blocks Drop-in program this month, and everyone had a lot of fun using their imaginations to build some cool creations.
- South Haven hosted their annual Mother's Day program, this year's theme was ice cream social.
- Portage hosted a Ready for Kindergarten program where young students are encouraged to explore stations that help them learn skills needed for kindergarten.
- Allison at the Valpo branch continues to coordinate projects to improve the Youth Services space. In May, the team shifted picture books and holiday books. Valpo team member, Liz has relabeled many of the YS shelves and has begun to create nonfiction image markers to make finding subjects easier for smaller kids.
- Courtney at the Valpo branch had a great turnout for the Teen Hangout program she led.
 This program allowed teens to destress and celebrate the end of the school year by participating in activities like painting and Lego building.
- Liz at the Valpo branch held a new program called the Art of Tea featuring the owner of a local business, the Tea and Spice Exchange.
- Ashley and Willow held a program at OE Respite at Lakeside ending the last monthly visit with a Book Bingo Night and promoting the Summer Reading Challenge.

Adult Services

- The CD relabeling project at the Valparaiso branch is finished, and all of the CDs have been sorted into their new sections. The team has done a great job staying focused and organized during this long haul of a project. The result is a much more intuitive browsing experience for patrons!
- The Valparaiso branch has seen a significant increase in the number of proctoring requests in May. The team proctored 4 exams for Valparaiso University students in May, and we already have 9 exams scheduled for June. We are pleased to be able to offer this important service to our community.
- Jennifer, an Employment Specialist with Goodwill, requested an informational interview
 with Monique to discuss what it is like to work at the library. Jennifer's client, Aiden, had
 great questions about what the Library Clerk position entails. It was a positive
 community connection, and they discussed the possibility of a tour or a job shadow in
 the future.
- Patrons are very excited that the adult painting program, Coffee and Canvas, was back again this month. There is so much interest that programming staff are looking into trying to do one every month.

Collections

- On May 2nd, Elizabeth joined Evergreen libraries across the country to live-test new features of the Evergreen OPAC (the public-facing portion). This opportunity allowed us to share our perspective with the Evergreen community on how best to serve patrons.
- The library began a partnership with Better World Books to replace the services lost when Discover Books closed without warning in March. We are pleased to have replaced this profit-sharing and eco-friendly way of disposing of unneeded books.
- The collections team has been working on several clean-up projects to help organize our collections better and to improve patron's access to our materials, such as relabeling TV series and cataloging Die Cut blocks for accessibility and inventory monitoring.
- Elizabeth helped with moving the new website forward by creating a detailed list of our resources and databases along with links to Niche Academy help guides.
- Inge, Jesse, and Elizabeth met with our state librarian, Jacob Speer, in mid-May to discuss improvements to the governance of the Indiana Digital Library consortium, as well as the Infoexpress courier delivery system.
- Requesting Die Cuts through Evergreen
 - Staff can now use Evergreen to request die cuts. HUGE shout out to Danielle Coleman in Collections for her assistance.

Genealogy

 The article for the Valparaiso Chamber of Commerce has been submitted and should be in the Summer edition of Chamber News. Tayler from South County has taken on the task of composing the article. We're excited about this opportunity to collaborate across library branches.

- Kathy continues to work on scanning historical Board minutes. A scanner has been
 moved from the Community Engagement team to the Genealogy workroom for this
 purpose. Kathy is making good progress and typically gets through a few years' worth of
 minutes per day.
- The department packed and sent three months of newspapers to the State Library for microfilming. Staff have not seen the films yet, but eagerly await the results.
- Chris M continues to work on fire department books. The forms they used changed, and more information had to be indexed.
- The department assisted patrons with a variety of requests, including, but not limited to, information about the Williams family, Dunn's bridge, and the water tower at the Journeyman building. Genealogy staff also provided obituaries by email, mail, and in-person pickup.
